School Timings

The gate opens at 8:35am, any children arriving before that time should be accompanied by an adult. The gate closes promptly at 8:50am, and any children arriving after 8:50am need to be taken to the office and signed in. It is imperative that we have an accurate record of who is on site at all times. The end of the day for Years R-2 is 3:15pm. Children in Reception are collected from the classroom; Year 1 exit from the top gate and Year 2 from the hall door. The end of the day for Years 3-6 is 3:25pm. Years 4, 5 and 6 exit from the top gate and Year 3 exit from the hall doors. Please ensure your child is collected from school promptly. If you are unable to collect your child on time, please make alternative arrangements. If your child is being collected by a different adult, please ensure you have informed the class teacher via the contact book or letter. Please try and avoid sending a message via the office.




School Uniform

We would like to remind parents that socks worn to school should be either grey or white and not black. Children in Years R, 1 and 2 should be using school book bags to carry their belongings in and children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 should be using school rucksacks. Girls who choose to tie their hair back or wear hair accessories may wear bows and headbands in the school colours of white and blue. Please remember that large hair accessories must not be worn to school. Finally, please ensure that all items of clothing are clearly named as this makes reuniting lost items with their rightful owner, much easier.

End of Day Collection Procedures


We would like to remind parents that our end of day procedures for dismissing children to a known adult require the class teacher to have sight of the adult or person collecting. This may mean that your child is asked to wait until this visual recognition can take place. This is a safeguarding measure in place to ensure all children are safely dismissed at the end of each day.

Also, if your child is being collected by another adult, please inform your child's class teacher via the contact book or letter. If you have several adults that collect your child on a regular basis, please put a note in the back of the contact book listing these adults. If your arrangements change during the day please inform the office by 12:00 noon where possible. Going home messages may not be passed to the class teacher in time if you call after 3:00pm. If you are held up unexpectedly at home time and are running late we will, of course, ensure your child is kept safe in school. However, late collections should not become regular. If you are unable to collect your child on time, please make alternative arrangements.



Yellow Lines

The yellow lines on the parent waiting areas outside the main hall and the gates on playground waiting area are there to remind parents to wait behind the lines. In the mornings this is to ensure that the children have plenty of space to enter the school and at the end of the day, this helps the teachers to more easily see the adults

Parking

We continue to receive complaints from residents of Huntingdon Road, Evenden Road and School Close regarding parking issues during the school drop off and pick up times. Can we please ask you to be considerate when parking on residential roads. We really do not want any accidents involving our children, parents or any members of the community. Thank you for your co-operation.

School Car Park

The school car park is closed at all times to parents, unless you are a Blue Badge holder or have prior permission.

Leave of Absence

Should you require to take your child out of school for any reason other than a medical appointment we would ask that you complete a Leave of Absence From detailing the reason for the request. In order for the request to be considered please include as much information as possible. Please be aware the Headteacher is not allowed to authorise absence for the purpose of a holiday. Forms can be downloaded from the school

Forgotten Items

We have a vast range of forgotten items, such as reading records, water bottles, homework and PE kit to name a few, that are regularly dropped off to the school office by parents, with the request that they are passed on to their child. We would very kindly request that any forgotten items, are left at home as it is very time consuming to try to ensure that all items brought to school late are reunited with their owner. Within school, children can often manage for one day without the item that they have forgotten; children would be able to access water fountains if they forget their drink bottle, use a spare PE kit and even have a hot dinner if they forget their lunch box. Within school, we also try to encourage all children to develop the skills of independence and being responsible for the items that they need in school each day is a great way to do this. You may well find that by not helping out in dropping off forgotten items to the school office, they only forget them once! From Term 2, we request that the only forgotten items that are dropped off at the school office are lunch boxes where absolutely necessary. Thank you for your support with this; we know that it will have a positive impact on the office staff.

Letters

Sometimes we issue letters that require a reply slip or acknowledgement to be returned to school. We would kindly request that these replies are given to the children to pass to their class teachers rather than being handed in by parents to staff within the school office. All classes have plastic wallets and each morning during registration any correspondence can be placed inside these, where it will then find it's way to the school office. By adopting this method, we are encouraging children to develop the skills of independence and responsibility, by ensuring that they pass on any communications to their class teacher themselves, rather than parents doing it for them. We would like to thank you in advance for supporting your child in developing such important skills.

Absence

If your child is absent from school, please telephone and leave a message on the absence extension before 9:15am on the first day of absence. When leaving messages on the school answer phone to advise of an absence, please state the type of illness your child is suffering from.

Sickness

If your child is absent with sickness and/or diarrhoea, please keep them at home for 48 hours after the last episode of sickness or diarrhoea.

Late book

Please remember that all children coming through the office late in the mornings need to be signed in. If they are not signed in and arrived late, it means that unnecessary calls may be made to parents/guardians.

Medication

Under no circumstance should your child carry medication, unless it has been agreed as part of a Care Plan. This includes calpol, cough sweets and creams etc. If a child requires over the counter medication this must be

administered by the parent. We are able to administer one dose of medicine if your child is on

a 4 dose a day prescribed medicine from the doctor. This needs to be in the original container with the dosage instructions clearly marked. The school cannot administer 3 times a day medicines.

Dogs

Dogs should not be brought onto the school grounds, even if they are in arms or a bag. The only exception to this is medical aid dogs.

Lateness

The first week of this school year started fantastically, with just 1 late recorded all week - well done everyone. Last week, the number of children arriving late for morning registration was 35! Please try to arrive at school promptly and certainly by 8:50am in order to ensure your child arrives in plenty of time for morning registration. The gates are open from 8:35am until 8:50am; the earlier your child arrives, the better the transition to class is for them. All classes have early morning tasks and activities set up and arriving in enough time ensures that your child can settle well into their class, preparing themselves for the day's learning in a calm and unrushed manner. Arriving on time will also help your child's class, work towards potentially achieving 'Punctuality Pup'. Additionally, when there are fewer than 10 lates recorded for the whole school within one week, all children are rewarded with a longer morning playtime on the following Monday, which they really enjoy. With your support as parents, I'm sure that this can be regularly achieved.

School Closure

In the event of a school closure due to severe weather or exceptional circumstances such as prolonged loss of electricity, parents will receive a text message from Parentmail, a notice will be put on the school website and an announcement will be made on the Echo Telephone information line 0844 4819235. We will keep you updated via Parentmail and announcements will be made on the following Radio Stations: Radio Kent and Heart FM. Every effort is made to keep the school open. In addition to the above, we have also signed up to the Kent Closures Website (www.kentclosures.co.uk) where a notice will be displayed advising if the school is open or closed.

Birthday Sweets

We would like to remind parents that we have a no Birthday Sweets policy within school and would ask that this is also kindly respected by parents and children not sharing such treats at the gates leading out from the school grounds.

Contacting Teachers

If you need to make contact with your child's class teacher, please write a message in the contact book. Teachers are busy at the beginning of the day preparing for lessons and it is difficult for them to see parents. Teachers are not available during the school day to contact parents. Any urgent messages can be left with the office.

Water Bottles

It is important that children stay hydrated throughout the day and to ensure this we strongly encourage all children to bring in a filled water bottle with them each day. We would like to remind you that these bottles should be plastic and kindly request that metal bottles are not brought in. It is also very helpful if bottles used have a sports cap type spout, rather than lids that need to be totally removed in order for children to have a drink. This is to limit accidental spillages that can sometimes occur with these types of bottle tops.

Coats

As the weather is starting to turn colder please ensure your child has a coat in school.



Lost Property

Already this term we have accumulated a large amount of lost property. To ensure the return of your child's clothing please ensure all items are named. If you would like to check lost property you can do so after school.

Data Collection Sheet

Last week, every child in our school was sent home with a Data Collection Form for parents to check and sign. These forms are an essential part in the efficient running of our school; therefore, please can you check the information on the form/s is correct and ensure that they are returned to your child's/children's class teacher as soon as possible. If any information contained on them is incorrect, please contact the school office as soon as possible.

Grass Banks

We would like to remind Reception parents that children should not be walking on the grass banks outside the Year 1 classroom.

Health Care and Medical Plans

If your child has a Health Care and Medical Plan, these have been sent home for parents to review. Please could these be returned to school as soon as possible.

Parent Helpers

Thank you to all parents who have already offered to help within school; your help is very much appreciated. If you would like to volunteer please put a note in your child's contact book stating the day and time you are available and your child's class teacher will get back to you.

Also, we are looking for a volunteer to help put information on to the Accelerated Reader Book System. If you are able to help, please contact the School Office.
